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### Learners with Mild Disabilities: A Characteristics ...

One of the most common learning characteristics of children with mild disabilities, indeed all disabilities, is that they have difficulty mastering academic content. In addition, these students frequently have difficulty with social behaviors and in finding appropriate work once their formal schooling ends (Olson & Platt, 2000).

### What are Mild Disabilities?

For instance, a recent study by May & Stone (2010) on disability stereotypes found that undergraduates with and without learning disabilities rated individuals with learning disabilities as being less able to learn or of lower ability than students without those disabilities. In fact, students with learning disabilities are no less able than any other student; they simply receive, process, store, and/or respond to information differently (National Center for Learning Disabilities).

### **What Is the Range of Special Education Students' Disabilities?**

In 2018–19, some 33 percent of all students who received special education services had specific learning disabilities, 19 percent had speech or language impairments, and 15 percent had other health impairments (including having limited strength, vitality, or alertness due to chronic or acute health problems such as a heart condition, tuberculosis, rheumatic fever, nephritis, asthma, sickle cell anemia, hemophilia, epilepsy, lead poisoning, leukemia, or diabetes).
